## **CAMPER GUIDELINES AND PROTOCOL FOR COVID-19 PREVENTION**

1. We are recommending that children 12 and over should be vaccinated.
2. Campers who are not vaccinated will be required to provide a negative viral test result 1-3 days before arrival to camp.
3. We are asking parents to please follow the travel guidelines from the CDC.
4. Campers will have temperature checks every morning before worship.
5. Campers will be placed in cohorts as recommended by the CDC.

**a. Upon arrival at camp, campers should be assigned to cohorts that will remain together for the entire camp session without mixing with other campers and staff in close contact circumstances. Consider campers and staff who are staying together in a cabin, bunkhouse, or similar defined space a “household cohort.” Household cohort members do not need to wear masks or physically distance when they are together without non-household cohort members nearby. Campers and staff should always wear masks when together unless staff are part of the household cohort and sleep in the same space as campers. When different household cohorts are using shared indoor or outdoor spaces together during the day or night, continue to monitor and enforce **mask use, physical distancing, and healthy hygiene** behaviors for everyone.**

6. Campers are required to have enough face masks or protective face gear that meet CDC guidelines for the length of the encampment.
7. Campers are required to wear face masks or any protective gear that meets the CDC guidelines when they are around other campers. EXCEPTIONS are when they are with their cohorts and water games.

## **PROTOCOL FOR CAMPERS WHO CONTRACT COVID-19**

1. SEC Administration will notify the parents of the infected camper to arrange pick of the child.
2. Child will be quarantined until departure from the campground.
3. The campers in the cohort of the infected camper will be tested and their parents will be notified of the breakout.
4. Campers will be relocated to another cabin.
5. The camper’s parents will have 24 hours to remove their child from the campground.
